Certain areas of criticism appear to be based on brief observations in limited settings.

We, the Parent Council, view the report differently and would like to offer our perspective on a few points that were raised. We aim to ensure that the reputation and professionalism of our Early Years institution remains unblemished.

Our Early Years staff are well-trained, educated professionals who thoughtfully structure the children's daily routines. The curriculum is play-based, as per IB guidelines, providing a comprehensive and balanced program for our early learners. Resources such as toys, books, and learning materials are rotated regularly to create an engaging environment. It's always ensured that there are ample resources available for the children to explore independently.

Mealtimes are orchestrated to be both a social experience and a period of relaxation for the children. Our staff teach good table manners, maintain a calm atmosphere, and introduce activities such as music, listening or reading a book aloud to balance social interaction with personal downtime.

Play is a major component of the Early Years curriculum, offering the children numerous opportunities for free play as well as guided play-based activities. These activities contribute to their cognitive, physical, social, and emotional development.

In conclusion, we want to emphasize that the AIS Early Years Campus is filled with caring staff members who prioritize the best interests of the children. They are committed to providing a nurturing and supportive environment for all the students at Aarhus International School.
